Enrolment



To be eligible to enrol in Prep in 2024 at Bucasia State School, your child must be born 1st July 2018 to 30th June 2019.

• Children must be 5 by 30 June in the year they start Prep.

Please note that you may pre-enrol for the 2024 Prep Year at our Administration Office. You will need to bring along your child's birth certificate for verification of age and their immunisation record. We are enrolment managed so proof of residency is also required (Rates, tenancy agreement, utilities invoice etc).

How to have a successful First Day of Prep:

- ✓ Pack your child's bag the day before. Make sure they have everything they need and that <u>everything is</u> <u>clearly marked with your child's name.</u>
- ✓ Remember to pack your child's school hat. If possible have a spare hat as hats get easily lost.
- Pack a set of spare clothes with each item named. Underwear is important. Place the spare clothes in a plastic bag and write your child's name on the outside. Clothes will remain in your child's school bag all year.
- Leave plenty of time to get ready as rushing can make your child feel anxious and make it harder for them to get a good start to the day.
- ✓ At approx. 9:40am children have a short 'Super Snack'. This snack must be fruit or vegetables. <u>Snacks</u> <u>do not go in the fridge.</u> At first lunch we encourage children to eat their cold and <u>healthy options</u> first and leave at least one other food item for second break.
- Make sure that lunch is packed in easy to access containers. In our school we aim to minimise packaging and waste. Your child should be able to open their lunch items by themselves. Make a small cut in packaged items to help them.
- ✓ Send a clearly named plastic water bottle for the classroom. <u>Water is the only option</u> no softdrink, juice or cordial. Thank you.
- ✓ Say goodbye when the bell goes and tell your child you are leaving and that you will be back in the afternoon.
- ✓ Be positive when picking up your child. Ask "Tell me the best thing/something about your day?"



Curriculum

As with all Queensland State Schools we teach and assess English, Maths, HASS, Technology, Physical Education, The Arts and Science as prescribed by the Australian Curriculum.

Learning

Bucasia State School Prep Teachers believe in providing a safe, positive and stimulating learning environment that offers rich learning opportunities that consider the learning styles and needs of every child in the class.

Age Appropriate Pedagogy (Pedagogy means teaching practice)

Bucasia State School is involved in an Age Appropriate Pedagogy initiative. This ensures that we deliver a balance and range of effective pedagogies such as active, agentic, collaborative, creative, explicit, language rich and dialogic, learner focused, narrative, playful, responsive, blended and scaffolded to make learning interesting and engage students.

Reporting

Parent / teacher interviews occur at the end of Term 1 and Term 3. This is a time when we set goals for the child that are ongoing for the year. They are discussed and re-evaluated in Term 3.

A report card is sent home at the end of Semester 1 (June) and Semester 2 (December).



Communication

The staff at Bucasia State School are willing to assist you with any question or concerns during your child's time with us and write a list for your transition meeting and sessions. Your child's teacher will provide their email address for you to contact them with any questions or concerns.

The best form of communication is to make an appointment to speak with your child's teacher – this can be done via email. The teacher aides are fantastic at taking important messages and passing them on to the teachers.

The administration staff are there for you to contact regarding various non-academic matters either in person, by phone or email.

A school newsletter is emailed on a fortnightly basis and can also be found on the school website and QSchools app, and classroom notes and updates are sent home on a regular basis. Please ensure administration staff have a current email address for this to occur.

Parade is held weekly with face-to-face every fortnight. Parents are welcome to attend this parade.

QSchools is a free app for all smartphones and using it, parents will have access to the school website, newsletters, news, notifications, tuckshop menu. Please download the app through iTunes or playstore as it is an excellent communication method. Office staff are able to assist you with this.

QParents is a free app for smartphones and parents can use this app to access their child's academic, behaviour and attendance records as well as notify the school of absences and pay for school expenses. It is an excellent tool to manage student absences and payments to the school. Office staff are able to assist you with this.

Prep Uniform



Prep children wear the Bucasia State School uniform as pictured.

Children are required to wear covered footwear and a wide brimmed hat. Uniforms and hats may be purchased from the school's Uniform shop the hours are as follows:-

Tuesday's 8:00am – 10.00am

Thursday's 2:00pm – 4:00pm

Cash and EFTPOS payments accepted **or** you can order via the FlexiSchools website.

We recommend that preps wear Velcro shoes unless they can independently tie their own laces.

Long Hair

Long hair must be tied back whilst at school. Head lice can be an issue in all school settings. Parents are asked to check their child's hair each day and inform the school if present. If we are all vigilant, there will be fewer outbreaks at school. We encourage hair ties to be school colours.

Excursions

Preps attend a number of various excursions or are involved with in-school events throughout the year. Excursions are to extend classroom learning in a real-world environment. Excursion notes will be sent home prior to any event. Parent volunteers are often required on these excursions.



Medication

For medical conditions such as asthma, epilepsy, anaphylaxis, etc,

we require an action plan be provided to the school office. Medication is administered by administration only. Please do not give medication to your child's teacher, however please inform them when medication is needed.

Money

When money is due for Prep excursions etc., please put the money in an envelope and mark it with your child's name, class, what the money is for and how much is enclosed. All payments are to be paid to the office – teachers CANNOT accept money - or alternatively you can pay using many electronic options available - *BPoint, QParents, Direct Debit, Centrepay.* **BPoint is the preferred payment option by the Department of Education.**

Behaviour

Bucasia State School is a PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) school. Please refer to the school Code of Conduct for behaviour expectations.

Lunches

There is a fridge in most classrooms for the children to keep their lunch cold. Food will <u>not</u> be heated up. If there is no fridge, an insulated lunch bag with ice brick will keep lunches cool.

Being at school is hard work, so by lunchtimes your child will be hungry. Your child will need a nutritious lunch. Monitor lunch boxes and talk with your child to see what they want in their lunch and also if they need more or less. Please note, this will change with the weather and their friendships. Most food Is eaten at 1st break (10:50am-11:00am)

When packing your child's lunch:

- Provide enough healthy food for 2 lunch breaks
- Fruit snack is to be packed separately
- Ensure that your child can open their lunchbox and containers and unwrap all items
- Provide a variety of smaller items rather than one or two large items
- Provide a water bottle every day
- Limit sugary snacks
- Keep sweets and party food for special occasions
- If you send items such as yoghurt, please pack a spoon.

Tuckshop is available every day at first break from Monday – Friday (and second breaks on Fridays). A tuckshop list will be sent home.

Prep students <u>must order</u> tuckshop via writing their name, class and order on a brown paper bag with the money enclosed **or** via the FlexiSchools website. The order is then placed in a tuckshop box which is located in their classroom. Tuckshop will then be delivered to the classroom in time for first break. Prep students <u>cannot</u> have money to order at the tuckshop by themselves. <u>FlexiSchools is the preferred option for ordering</u> tuckshop. There is also EFTPOS available in the tuckshop for payments before school.









Prep Sample Daily Routine

8:50am	First bell rings – goodbye to parents and sit on carpet
8:50am	Learning begins with morning session of roll & phonics, phonemic awareness and articulation activities.
9:00am	Literacy focused lesson & activities
9:40am	Super Snack – Healthy snack and water break
10:00am	Continue literacy activities
10:50am	First Lunch Break is supervised outside in the courtyard with Year 1 and Year 2 students
11:00am	Supervised playtime outside on playgrounds and sandpit
11:30am	Back to class
11:45am	Numeracy focused lessons and activities
1:00pm	Second Lunch Break is supervised outside in courtyard with Year 1 and Year 2 students.
1:10pm	Supervised playtime outside on playgrounds and sandpit
1:40pm	Back to class
1:40 to 1:50pm	Roll
1:50 to 3pm	Science / HASS / The Arts / PE / Technology

Afternoon Pick Up

In the afternoon we request that you collect your child from the classroom at 3pm. To avoid distractions, please wait outside the Prep rooms in the grassed areas, or on the benches until the teacher invites you to collect your child. Please do not wait on the verandahs as this can become very congested and distracting.

Dear Parents,

The fees for 2024 will be \$60 for years Prep to Year 6. This fee supplements materials for art, craft, cooking, construction and other activities conducted as part of classroom programs. It also contributes to the photocopying costs in place of set texts in specific subject areas.

Due to past fundraising, each class has a refrigerator for student use. We encourage students to purchase lunchboxes of a <u>reasonable size</u> so that they can fit in the fridges. Due to class sizes, there can be up to 25 lunch boxes in the fridge. As fridges become older and break down this causes a financial strain on our P & C and may not be replaced. Please check if your child's classroom has access to a class fridge.
